REFLECTION - Red Lights

It was difficult waiting and watching as Parkinson's disease slowly paralysed my father's faculties. He who loved carrying children swinging golf clubs and tending his roses and beloved family was now carried every step of the way. At times this



was very awkward; both for those who carried him and for the one who struggled to allow the carrying.

From our birth, you and I have been carried countless times in loving arms or on strong shoulders....and done the same for others! And sometime in the future, we will be carried by at least four strong men, only then we won't know about it! Carrying another and allowing oneself to be carried can be an awkward business. There are numerous other carrying too. There's the ache of the drug addicted son or sister, the burden of unemployment, the pain of mental or terminal illness, broken relationships and so on.

So what has this to do with today's gospel? Jesus was attentive to his surroundings when he went into Naim. Jesus watched the dead man being carried out, he saw the widow in tears. He knew what her future would be like without her son; perhaps he may have even given a thought to Mary, his own mother who would also be carrying her own son in grief in the not too distant future.

In this gospel, we encounter Jesus as the Lord of all life. He is able to carry each of us when times are difficult. No matter what is going on in our lives or in the lives of our loved ones, Jesus is attentive to what is happening. He asks us to place our trust in him.
