God's great intervention...

- The two pregnant women in our Gospel today are different in age and show their concern, generosity and goodness for each other. These two great women understand the miracle of conception and birth. And in each case there was divine intervention in a truly exceptional way. The fact that these two women had this divine intervention is a reminder that our own lives too are a aift of God; what we might call ordinary grace. It is from this understanding that the Church takes its position on all life issues.
- At some moments we may recognise the hand of God in our lives. Maybe at the point when we felt we had a priestly or religious vocation or when we finally decided on our partner in marriage. Maybe it was at the birth of a child, a change in job circumstances, or the death of a parent. Maybe it was a moment in prayer, the grace of a sacrament, advice in the confessional, wise words from a friend or relative at a critical moment. Remember that every now and then, God sends people to be with us in our difficult moments to help us. Misfortune comes without warning, but miracles do happen unexpectedly.

We must have that faith.

- God continues to work with us and for us. God takes the long view and there are periods of seeming barrenness, seeming aloneness. But these are all part of that gestation which is life on earth. We were born into this world and we will be reborn into eternal life.
